Domestic Violence Action Month Proclamation – 2024

Whereas, domestic violence remains a pervasive issue across Cumberland County, the United Sates and the world with implications for personal and community health;

Whereas, domestic violence affects people of all genders, sexual orientations, ages, racial, ethnic, cultural, social, religious, and economic groups in the United States and here in Cumberland County;

Whereas, in 2023, 15,147 people received help from the Maine Coalition to End Domestic Violence Resource Centers, and 50% had at least one child in the home;

Whereas, in 2023 Through These Doors, Cumberland County's Domestic Violence Resource Center, served 2,958 unduplicated individuals, received 8,192 helpline calls and provided 5,480 bed nights at shelter;

Whereas, there were 10 domestic violence related homicides in Maine in 2023;

Whereas, half of all women who were murdered in the US were killed by a current or former partner or family member;

Whereas, research shows that a protective factor in preventing domestic violence is creating a community where people are connected, supported and care for each other;

Whereas, every day in Cumberland County individuals and organizations support people impacted by domestic violence by providing therapeutic, legal, educational, housing, advocacy, and medical services;

Whereas, all of us have a vital role in preventing and one day ending domestic violence; now, therefore, be it

Resolved that the Cumberland County Commissioners hereby proclaim October 2024, as Domestic Violence Action Month in Cumberland County.
